## What You'll Do:

- **Residency:** Spend three days immersed in the Imaginal Field, drawing creative inspiration from a the field.
- Making Days: Receive funding for three additional days to create new works in your chosen medium, inspired by your residency experience.
- Exhibition: Showcase your completed work at the *Imaginal Field* exhibition in late 2025.
- **Community Engagement:** Lead a community activity during your residency, sharing your artistic perspective and engaging with the local community.

## What We're Looking For:

- Artists working in any medium (visual arts, sound, sculpture, performance, etc.).
- A strong connection to the **local area** and community.
- A commitment to a nature-based creative practice.

## **Details:**

- **Dates:** Residencies will be scheduled in 2025 (specific dates to be confirmed with selected artists).
- Location: type "Imaginal Field" into Google Maps, 60 Cross Drove, Nr Coates village, Fenland. PE7 2HJ
- Fee: £1274.28, covering the residency, making days, and engagement activity. Plus travel allowance.

- 2. Examples of previous work (up to 5 images or links to online work).
